

PLENTY 4 ALL

The floods in Kenya finally receded and with the roads and bridges rebuilt Pollycap Ogalo was able to travel to Emulama and deliver the last 4 Haines Solar Ovens to Joseph Alela and his Plenty4All Coop.

In Ndhiwa 2 acres were flooded destroying a very promising crop of The Three Sisters. Yes, I'm talking about the American Indian practice of growing corn, peas and squash together and it was growing nicely. Even more serious is the loss of topsoil which is critical to growing crops.

Meanwhile in Lumuruti, Jackline Miriti and the women and children of the Plenty4All Coop have just harvested an abundant crop of sweet potatoes, maize and vegetables. After harvesting the fields were immediately prepared for planting the next rotation of crops.

It is important to have the right seeds at the proper time to successfully plant, grow and harvest crops. Local indigenous heirloom seeds that can be saved are purchased by each of the Plenty4All Coops locally with funds sent by Pollycap. The seeds in the bowls were chosen by the Plenty4All

FINANCIAL UPDATE

"I'm not gonna give up, shut up, or let up, until I'm taken up... as a matter of fact, I'm just getting warmed up."

~ Zig Zigler

This quote from Zig Ziglar seem to define the spirit of the St. Paul's community. Even with declining membership the last 20+ years, we continue to push forward with our eyes on the future and confidence that our mission will continue to serve the community.

One important element in our continuance is our financial survival. Let me begin by stating that with our Foundation and investment accounts, we are in a position that almost all other "traditional congregations" would find enviable. We are most certainly not in immediate danger financially.

We are also thankful for the members who have supported us in the past and continue to support St. Paul's with their offerings and donations.

But we must also be aware that life in the 21st century is very different, and we will need to be creative in finding other alternate sources of income as our Sunday morning envelopes will not be sufficient to sustain us forever. We have all heard various versions of the wisdom that "we must grow or die".



FINANCIAL UPDATE

So, using Zig's quote as a template, here are some things I would ask that you prayerfully consider.

Not gonna give up – This one we seem to have a handle on, as seen in the volunteer hours that our membership puts in whenever and wherever it is needed. We believe in the mission of St. Paul's, and trust that God is working through St. Paul's still.

Not gonna shut up – This is a big one. We need to be willing to speak up about the vital missions that take place at St. Paul's. Contributions do not need to come only from those who show up on Sunday Morning. As we have seen from the success of the Heart Gallery, events drawing people from outside our membership can result in donations that we would not otherwise receive.

So, we need to be intentional about sharing these events with everyone we know. An especially relevant event currently is the Parish House Anniversary Fund that Kate has spearheaded. So often when I mention St. Paul's to people I come in contact with, they will relate a story about being touched by St. Paul's at some time in their past. These people want St. Paul's to continue to succeed even though they may not want to show up on Sunday morning. We need to be diligent in sharing opportunities for them to support the ministry.

Never gonna let up – Approximately 2 years ago we began to look more purposefully for opportunities to receive grant funds, and have had some success in that area. One of the biggest challenges in receiving grant money is simply knowing what grants exist and the processes to apply for them. Does your employer (or prior employer) have a grant program? How about any fraternal organizations or groups you belong to? I urge you to keep your eyes and ears open, to look for grant opportunities and bring them to the attention of Kate or myself. Neither of us is shy about asking for support, so if you don't want to run with it yourself, give us the ball and we will follow up.

Other sources of revenue are being explored such as the donut ministry, the celebration of life ministry, and rental/use of the building. Please be open to the use of our building (which I know so many of you love) by outsiders and the public. Letting our light shine by sharing our spaces can be both a ministry and a source of revenue.

If you are not aware, both Thrivent and Kroger have programs that are providing money to St. Paul's. If you are a member of Thrivent or have a Kroger plus card, Ashley can give you information on how your purchases can benefit St. Paul's. Maybe your relatives and neighbors can sign up too. Every little bit helps. It cost nothing to sign up, so why not?

Until I am taken up – This can be a touchy subject to some, but the truth is that much of our past financial stability has come from memorials. Have you included a donation to St. Paul's in your will? Would St. Paul's be listed as a suggested donation for people who want to send a contribution in your honor? Support from people long gone is still supporting what we do today, so think about the opportunity to pay forward into the future ministries of St. Paul's.

We are just getting warmed up as we take St. Paul's into the future, so please continue to support this ministry, give thought to what resources you may know of and how they may be able to be a blessing to St. Paul's, and think creatively about additional ways for St. Paul's to generate the revenue needed to continue to be the church with a heart in the heart of Toledo.



100th ANNIVERSARY PARISH HALL

St. Paul's Lutheran Church has a rich 172 year history of innovative worship and outreach that has adapted to meet the changing needs of its congregation surrounding community. Many landmark events, including the of the formation American (1930), have Lutheran Church taken place within its walls, which remain an exquisite example of Gothic architecture in the heart of Toledo, with 20' stunning stained glass windows lining each side of the sanctuary.

The Parish Hall addition was completed in September 1924. Built to house a school, Sunday school, and staff offices, it also boasted a third floor gymnasium with showers, a Ladies Parlor, and auditorium with dramatic an chandeliers and wrap around balcony. One hundred years of educational programming, basketball and dart ball leagues and city tournaments, ladies teas,

Luther League and numerous mission events have been held within its walls. For the past seven years, the Parish Hall has been used primarily for HeART Gallery functions - a new ministry of St. Paul's. We invite you to donate to our Parish House fundraiser and provide quality help us to programming, building updates, and experiences that promote faith building, conversation and inspiration.
