

This radical inclusion got him into all sorts of trouble. Eventually it paved the way for his death as a political statement on a cross, You see many people were offended by his radical, inclusive love. It threatened their power, sense of control, and way of being in the world.

If you think the love of God is "nice".....think again. The love of God as expressed through Jesus is radical. It is offensive to many and it will get us into trouble, good trouble. You know I'd even argue that if we aren't getting into trouble as Christians, as a Church, for radically loving all those society excludes, then maybe we aren't loving the Jesus way enough!

Take a minute and think about who is excluded in our community at this time? Personally, I see immigrants (being one myself) excluded. How can I radically love immigrants the way Jesus does? I see members of the LGBTQ community threatened. How can I radically love that community the way Jesus does? I see underserved people who live all around us - veterans, people with mental illness and people with physical disabilities excluded from the everyday opportunities we take for granted. How can I, how can we as Church, radically show the love of Jesus to the under served? I also see the elderly and lonely, the homebound, the sick (especially in my association with Mercy St. Vincent Medical Center). How can they be radically loved by this Church representing Jesus?

Yes, Jesus walked this earth 2000 years ago. He still walks this earth, but he wears our shoes. As St. Paul's transitions to a new pastor and new ministries, consider the questions, "where is God calling us to go? To whom is God wanting us to show the radical love of Jesus in our community? Who needs the love of Jesus the most at this point in history?" Prayerfully ask God, "With our limited resources at St Paul's, Lord to whom shall we go?" And then prepare to get into good trouble, because Jesus will be walking in your shoes!

# PLENTY 4 ALL

In 2016 Pollycap Ogalo and I organized our first Plenty4All Coop in Ndhiwa, Kenya. Since that time we started 2 other Plenty4All Coops in Lumuruti and Emulama, Kenya. All these are grassroots farming communities with limited water resources and no electricity at all. No lights at night and no way to even charge a cell phone. All cooking is primarily done by burning wood or charcoal. We built rainwater collection systems in all the Coops then provided them with a 12v solar collection system that could power a water pump. This allowed us to

store water in tanks on towers and use gravity and drip irrigation systems to grow food. This also provided Coop Members a means of charging their cell phones and some lights.

Over the last 9 years solar technology has changed and made it possible to generate significantly greater amounts of power from smaller solar generator units. These types of solar generators are now available in Kenya and Pollycap and I have started Project Kenya to bring this technology to our Plenty4All Coops. At this point we have already purchased an EcoFlow Delta 2 Max 2400W solar generator and a 160W solar panel for Pollycap in Ndhiwa. This will provide the power we need to build a Plenty4All Training Center in Ndhiwa. We plan on purchasing smaller units for all the Plenty4All Members and the Project Managers. These units will all come with solar panels and Kenya has lots of sunlight.






Portable Solar Panel

We will begin by training the Project Managers how to use the EcoFlow River 3 Plus 600W solar generators which they can take home and then teach their Coop Members how to use. We currently have the funds for the 3 systems needed to train the Project Managers but will need to raise money for 15 more units later (\$300 @ unit). We plan on purchasing the first three units during Black Friday sales in November.

Perhaps the most ambitious part of Project Kenya is to build a Plenty4All Training Center. This will be a multipurpose building that can house guests, serve as a classroom, provide space for meetings and offer a clean facility for health services to be provided. It is my intentions to raise funds to build the training center before Nov. 2025. The first stage of construction will be the building itself which will cost approximately \$4000. Inside construction costs are still being considered. After construction is complete it will be possible to bring the Project Managers to stay as guests and receive training for the solar generator systems. As funds are raised for additional EcoFlow River 3 Plus systems they can be shipped directly to the Plenty4All Coop Managers who can train their members.



In creating an opportunity for grassroots farmers to live a more sustainable lifestyle and be able to feed and educate their children Plenty4All has developed projects and programs that have been recognized as being significant in restoring a balance in natural systems that effect climate change. David Bruce Merlo's recent book "Unlocking the Power of Nature Solving the Climatic Crisis Through Water CO2 and Carbon Cycle Science" points out our projects with Biogas, Biochar, Soil restoration, Planting Trees and Solar Energy as methods that can restore a balance to our natural systems. What we have learned we are willing to teach and this is why the Plenty4All Training Center is so important. Bruce's book is available on Patreon: http://www.patreon.com/


# **LUNCH & LEARN**
